Save Our Trees!

National Boulevard Pine Trees Threatened

Could this be the last Christmas for the pine trees on National Boulevard between Butler and Federal?

Neighbor Donna Strull has brought it to the attention of the NWNA that the City of Los Angeles plans to remove ALL trees from 111431 - 11533 W. National Boulevard. A notice has

been posted stating that the trees will be cut down, the sidewalk replaced and then the trees replanted. The



notice has been posted on only two of the trees which may have given some the impression that only a few of the trees were being removed. No hearing has been scheduled or announced.

We have contacted the Street Tree Division of the Bureau of Street Services in order to find out more information and hope to find out if it is at all possible to repair the sidewalks without removing trees that have been in this neighborhood for 40+ years. Stay tuned!

Seven Weeks to a Safer Life (and a Better Neighbor) One North Westdaler's CERT Training Experience

Over the past couple of years, I've often printed information in this newsletter about upcoming Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) trainings. But it wasn't until this past October that I finally had the opportunity to take the course myself and can now share with you what a valuable and informative experience CERT offers.

The course was taught by Los Angeles Firefighter Shapiro for two and a half hours on Tuesday evenings at UCLA. Every week I learned something that would help me take care of myself and my family and friends during an emergency or natural disaster. Perhaps the most important fact, and initially the scariest, was that in a large scale disaster (such as an earthquake), emergency services will be unavailable to assist us, possibly for several days. Sure, I'd seen Hurricane Katrina on the news, but I never related that to the risk of living in an earthquake prone area. And earthquakes strike without warning. The course was so timely — the week before the San Diego/Malibu fires, we discussed planning ahead what items we should save if we ever needed to evacuate our house with only a few minutes notice.

After scaring us half to death, Firefighter Shapiro then equipped us with the knowledge that would help dispel our fears. We learned what types of equipment and supplies we should have on hand, how to assess a disaster area, how to triage the injured, how to check the people for injuries and treat minor injuries, how to conduct search and rescue operations, how to put out small fires (we even got to use a fire extinguisher on a real fire) and much more. Best of all, my next door neighbor happened to take the same CERT training with me, so right now the 2700 block of Barry Avenue is very prepared!

Anyway, I hope I can convey to you a little of how valuable this course has been to me. If you haven't thought much about preparing for a disaster, I highly recommend you take this course (upcoming dates are below).

I know it can be difficult to find time, so an abbreviated half-day course is also available. If you would be interested in this option, please contact me.
