This will be an important first step in getting our neighborhood better prepared in the event of a major disaster.

This information will not be shared with anyone or used for any other

purpose than to organize neighbors in the course of disaster preparation.

In a large-scale disaster, we will not be able to depend on emergency services (police, fire and medical) being immediately available. For a few hours or even several days, we may need to depend on each other for assistance. Knowing who in our neighborhood has specialized training will help us to create a neighborhood emergency action plan.

Or come to a NWNA meeting and ask someone who has completed the training to share their experience. CERT training is a great way to make yourself and your neighborhood a little safer!

Soup Label and Box Top Collection

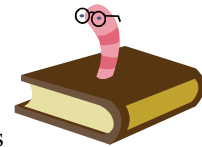

In anticipation of your Thanksgiving Day menu, the Mar Vista Farmers Market has a great supply of produce for your table. There are Yukon gold, banana fingerling and red potatoes as well as sweet potatoes and yams. Broccoli and cauliflower would make great side dishes along with red beets and golden beets. If your recipes include nuts, there are walnuts, pecans, almonds and pistachios at the farmers market. Granny Smith apples are ready for pies and other desserts. Satsuma mandarins are now available along with several persimmon varieties. This is only a brief list of what you will find at the farmers market.

During this rating period Burglary/Theft from Motor Vehicle (BFMV) has become a problem in Basic Car 14A25 area. I am

happy to report this period we reduced crime in all categories except burglary/theft from motor vehicle. We continue to leave our vehicles unsecured and with property in plain sight. Lock and secure your vehicle anytime it is unattended. Attempt to park your vehicle in well-lit areas; lighting can be a strong deterrent against burglary/theft from motor vehicle suspects. Do not use your glove-box as a traveling safe, it is the first place BFMV suspects look. Place items of value in your trunk of your vehicle out of sight. Arm and deploy any anti-theft devices you may have for

your vehicle, no device in the world can help protect your vehicle if you do not use it. If you observe any suspicious activity be a good neighborhood and call the police right away. Join your local Neighborhood Watch Group it is still the best tool we have against crime.
