

Monthly Farmers Market Report

How was your summer? Here are responses from several vendors of the Mar Vista Farmers Market when asked about their summer growing season. John from Summer Harvest Farms of Dinuba felt that a cooler than normal spring plus rain in late spring resulted in decreased production of peaches and nectarines. He feels the flavor of his fruit was good but the rain caused brown rot and less fruit brought to the market. He is beginning to transition to red grapes which should be available through November.

Chiuefuer of Central Valley Farms in Fresno has had a good summer with enough heat to keep his tables filled with vegetables. Eggplant requires much heat and his tables are currently filled with a several varieties. Eggplant should remain available well into September. Gloria from Tamai Farms in Oxnard has had problems this year with tomato production due to cooler than normal spring weather. She indicated that there was no initial production from her tomato plants but the coming crop looks more promising but still weak.

Yvette of Arnett Farms has had a great summer with several pluot varieties available longer than normal. Crimson Glow pluots should be available for another two weeks, which will be a long growing season. The same goes for Flavor King pluots with their robust flavor. Look for Arnett Farm's white peaches: the bigger the tastier.
